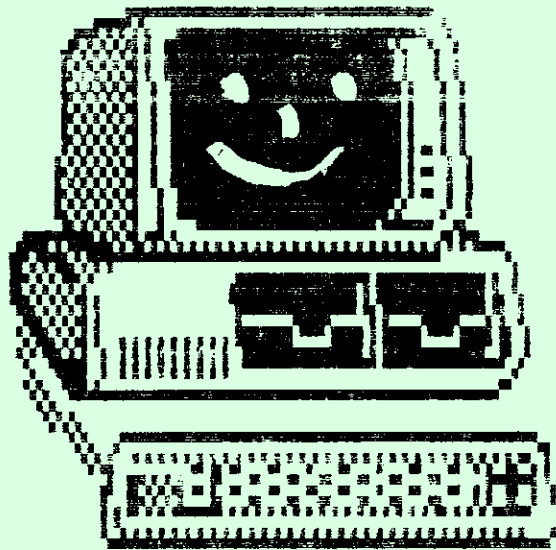

Scince the keyboard is a device, it can be opened. Try this program and run it, but pay close attention to line 30:

This month for programming, we are going to do something a bit useful if you are a programmer. We are going to create High Resolution Graphics. I suppose you are all wondering 'What in the world is a HIGH RESOLUTION GRAPHIC?' Well, on your computer, whatever you type in is a Low Resolution Graphic. It's just plain, straight lines. No circles. Then there is Medium Resolution Graphics. Those you need alot of programming. They are still pretty squared off. Then there is High Resolution Graphics. They are super round. 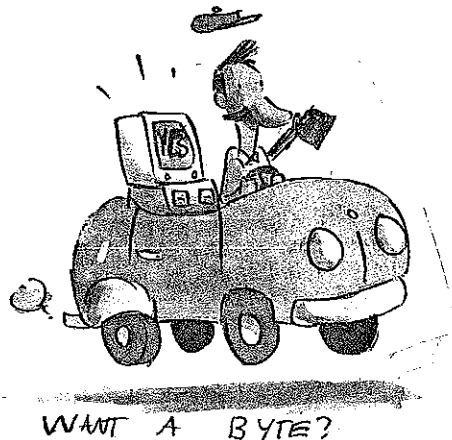
Apple Computing

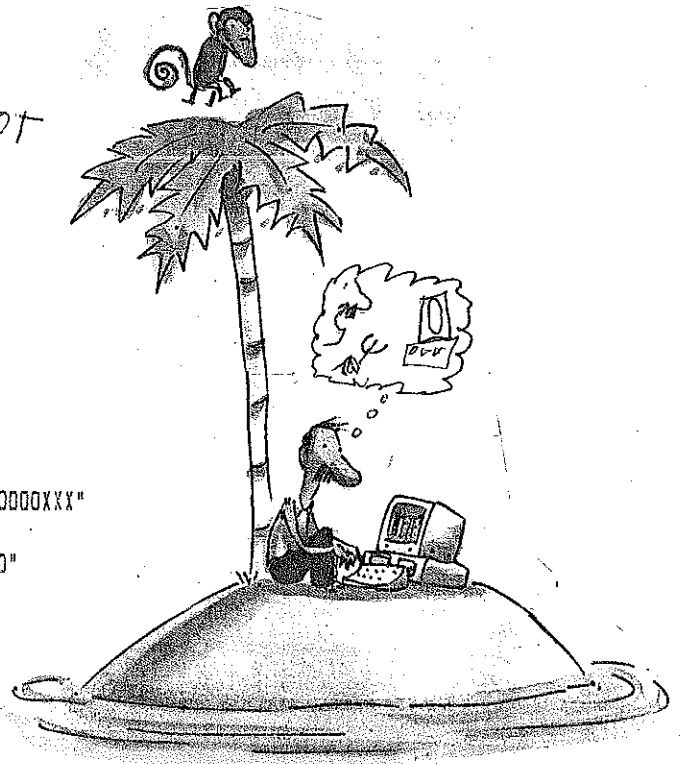

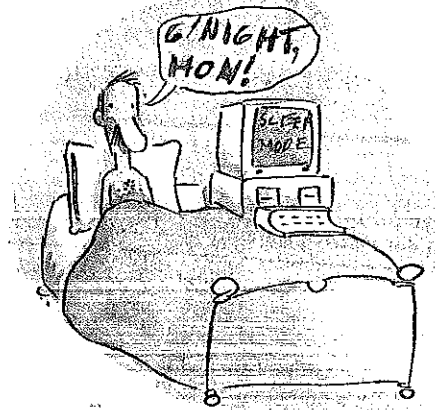
